EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTRE EXPLAINED

March 24, 2020

On Monday, March 23rd, the District of Logan Lake formally activated Level 1 of its Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and to support the Province's State of Emergency and its health orders.

What does this mean?

Logan Lake's Level 1 EOC comprises the Mayor, the Chief Administrative Officer, the Emergency Coordinator, and the Deputy Emergency Coordinator. By activating its EOC, this means Logan Lake can officially request aid from the Province, if required, to recover expenses and to resource expenses that may occur as a result of the pandemic. The EOC makes decisions and recommendations, such as the closing of buildings or implementing other safety measures, that affect the Public.

If needed, the EOC may make further recommendations and implement additional measures as needed over time as the situation evolves. For example, closing parks and playgrounds may be necessary if social/physical distancing is not occurring.

The Logan Lake EOC will be open Monday to Friday, 8:30 am – 4:00 pm daily.
