



Council Highlights – October 13 & 27, 2020

1. Council approved Grant-In-Kind request from the LL Minor Hockey Association valued at \$15,000 for ice arena rental for the 2020/2021 season;
2. Council directed staff to work with the Golf Course Executive regarding issues identified during their Committee of the Whole presentation, and report back to Council;
3. Council approved the 2021 Community Resiliency Investment Program Grant application in the amount of \$254,680;
4. Council approved a letter be sent to Martin Ince, MKI Wind Energy, thanking him for his presentation and looks forward to hearing updates on activities of MKI Wind Energy projects in the area;
5. Council approved a letter be sent to Devin Crossman thanking him for his presentation regarding a skate park in Logan Lake and that the District looks forward to hearing from the Group regarding questions that arose during the presentation;
6. Council adopted Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaw No.865, 2020
7. Council approved rental of the Community Hall space at the Rec. Ctr. provided user groups have a COVID Plan as approved by the Director of Public Works & Recreation and have consulted Rec. Ctr. staff;
8. Council approved Community Hall rental rates be reviewed at the next Provisional Budget meeting and that staff provide a report on current rental rates for the Community Hall for Council review at that meeting;
9. Council supported in principal the Engagement Terms of Reference for the Logan Lake Community Forest Corporation;
10. Council approved that a letter be sent to Adrian Dix, Minister of Health expressing their concerns regarding the absence of a flu clinic in our community and the availability of flu shots during a pandemic; and that Council is disappointed with the lack of communication with Interior Health in contacting the municipality for rental spaces to schedule a flu clinic for the residents of Logan Lake; and that a copy of the letter be sent to Dr. Bonnie Henry, Provincial Health Officer for BC and Interior Health;
11. Council tabled the request for a Grant-in-Aid from the Logan Lake Lions for the production of a newspaper to a future Council Meeting and asked that staff contact the Logan Lake Lions Club for clarification regarding the business name or group that will be running the newspaper;
12. Council approved the 2020 Evacuation Route Planning Grant application in the amount of \$21,855.00.

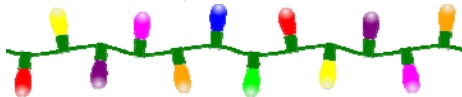

Public Works Reminders

Snow Removal

The District is asking residents to please remember that when Public Works staff undertake snow clearing, the objective is to clear the roads for safe driving and the walkways for pedestrian safety. Although we understand that there is some inconvenience for residents when the snow is pushed into driveways, please recognize that it is unavoidable. Also, your assistance by removing vehicles from the roadway is appreciated.



Water Lines & Taps

Please ensure your outside taps are drained before the cold weather hits, AND if your water lines are in danger of freezing over the winter, please ensure they are wrapped with heat tape.

Operating a Wood Stove

The key to maintaining a good fire is careful control of the air supply, which determines how completely the fuel is burned.

Excessive smoke from a chimney in the middle of a burn is a sign of incomplete combustion and creates problems. Some smoke should be visible when you light the fire, but for the remainder of the burn it should be almost invisible. If the smoke doesn't burn in the firebox, it will go up the chimney and form flammable creosote deposits that can lead to a chimney fire, or lead to air pollution.

Please use safe burning practices when using your wood burning stove.
